The IMPACT Program

IMPACT is a collaborative effort between Accent 121, Lutheran Child & Family Services of Kentucky and Indiana (LCFS) and Community Hospital to provide comprehensive care coordination and intensive therapeutic services for at-risk children who are at moderate to high risk of placement. The need for this service was identified by the Marion County Juvenile Justice System, due to the high correlation between victims of human trafficking and youth who have run away from home.

In response, Accent 121 and LCFS have come together to provide coordinated care for these youth to undergo comprehensive screening and evaluation, while simultaneously ensuring adequate containment and stabilization, to determine the most effective treatment options for ongoing care. It is the intent of these services to provide a rapid transition to less restrictive care while simultaneously assisting the state in better recognizing and identifying children who have been exploited.

This program will be made available to at-risk youth between the ages of 11 and 18 who have a history of placement, sexual exploitation and/or are considered to be at serious risk of such. Services to be offered will include the following:

• Therapeutic Residential Placement: Children accepted to the program will be admitted for a 30-day residential placement period at Lutherwood. This placement will offer a safe and
